

Basic Cheese Ball Recipe by Johnn Pasqual

2 packages Philly Cream Cheese

402 Crumbled Blue Cheese

402 Goat Cheese

2 TBS favorite sherry or brandy

Work cheese together in a bowl at room temperature by hand or paddle mixer. Form into a ball or any shape desired and chill to set.

Top with Hot Pepper Jelly & Crushed Pecans to serve.

The contest also asks entrants to write about the mystery harbor so their answers (below) were published in the following issue.
